
HORTICULTURE

Conditions of Entry to Flowers, Vegetables, Domestic Produce, Wine, Handicraft, Photography, Ceramics and Amateur Art Classes.

1. Entries Fees – Please see Conditions below
2. Classes 1 – 71 must be the produce of the Exhibitor's own garden, and in the other classes, the product of his or her own work.
3. All exhibits must be staged between 2.00pm and 9.30pm (lighting will be available on Friday 7th August, and between 6.00am and 8.00am on Saturday 8th August 2009). The Marquee will be cleared for Judging at 8.30am and exhibits cannot be accepted after that time.
4. No FREE entry onto the Showground after 8.00am.
5. The exhibits must not be cleared away until after 5.00pm.
6. The Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage to any exhibits. All such risk being accepted by the Exhibitor.
7. The Marquee will be open to the public from 10.45am to 5.00pm.
8. Flowers, Vegetables and Fruit will be judged in accordance with the R.H.S. Show Handbook 2001.
9. To the best of our knowledge, all information and rules are correct at the time of schedule going to print.
10. No car parking is permitted on the showground but unloading/loading is of course permitted prior to showday and until 8.00am on showday itself – cars must then be parked in the General Car Parks and may return to the showground for loading on showday after 5pm.
11. The Society has decided that certain classes will be designated "Men Only" or "Children Only"
12. Entry to Children's Classes are free

Wine should be exhibited in CLEAR or only slightly tinted glass bottles of approximately 26fl oz with rounded shoulders. Bottles should be filled to leave an airspace between the bottom on the cork and the surface of the wine of between 1/4” to 3/4”. Plastic flanged corks to be used.

Helpful Hints:

Dry wines, red and white can be fairly astringent but have no hint of recognisable sweetness. Table Wine is intended to accompany and enhance food – therefore not too highly flavoured. Dessert Wine should be rich, fruity and vinous mellow and mature, with an alcohol content as high as can be achieved by natural fermentation.
