4. No FREE entry onto the Showground after 8.00am.
5. The exhibits must not be cleared away until after 5.00pm.
6. The Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage to any exhibits. All such risk being accepted by the Exhibitor.

Wine should be exhibited in CLEAR or only slightly tinted glass bottles of approximately 26fl oz with rounded shoulders. Bottles should be filled to leave an airspace between the bottom on the cork and the surface of the wine of between 1/4" to 3/4". Plastic flanged corks to be used.

Helpful Hints:

Dry wines, red and white can be fairly astringent but have no hint of recognisable sweetness. Table Wine is intended to accompany and enhance food – therefore not too highly flavoured. Dessert Wine should be rich, fruity and vinous mellow and mature, with an alcohol content as high as can be achieved by natural fermentation.
